Newark, NJ – Rutgers New Jersey Medical School's (NJMS) Department of Psychiatry will host their 2016 Transgender Health Conference. During this conference, attendees will learn about effective strategies to advance the health of transgender patients and how to develop practical skills that can be readily applied to everyday clinical practices.

Many people do not know the challenges transgender patients face when engaging with health care provides, which leads to the importance of bringing together health professionals to discuss the issues. According to Dr. Petros Levounis, in his recent article for <u>Medical Xpress</u>, "Transgender patients do not have it easy. Part of the problem has to do with flat-out prejudice and discrimination that many LGBT people experience.
