Healthy Living Initiative Program Will Host Empowerment Workshop

Newark, N.J. - On Tuesday, August 19, the New Jersey Medical School's (NJMS) Healthy Living Initiative (HLI) program will continue their ongoing Wellness Series with an empowerment workshop titled "Healthy Body Healthy Life" with facilitator Dee Marshall. This workshop is open to HLI program participants touching on topics of advancing life skills, self-awareness, and empowerment.

The HLI program is designed as a systems' intervention, addressing behavioral, cultural, social and structural barriers to healthy living, particularly among young children living in low-income neighborhoods. Led by Dr. Hanaa Hamdi, associate professor in the Department of Family Medicine at NJMS, and a panel of expert advisory board members have successfully implemented several feasibility components of HLI.
