

Father Doctor Like Istafanous, MD, is an assistant professor of the Psychiatry Voluntary Faculty at Rutgers New Jersey Medical School. He completed his residency training in 2004 at Rutgers NUKS and remained an attending psychiatrist until 2010. He fett called to become a priest in the Coptio Orthodox Church and later founded and medically directed St. Luke's Behavioral Community and Health Services, a Christian faith-based psychiatric outpatient and independent nonprofit organization located in Belleville, NJ. The faoility offers services to the public free of charge and is self-hunded by private donors. Father Istafanous recognizes the best standard of care includes all aspects of the individual, the bio-psycho-socio-spiritual.
