The [George F. Smith Library of the Health Sciences](#), located on the Newark campus of Rutgers Health, houses the largest print collection of the Rutgers Health Libraries and provides access to databases, journals, and other electronic resources supporting medicine, nursing, dentistry, public health, and health-related professions. Smith Library collaborates with the [Robert Wood Johnson Library of the Health Sciences](#) in New Brunswick to provide access to resources, instructional and educational programs, and professional reference and evidence-based synthesis services supporting students, faculty, staff, and researchers across Rutgers Health. The library's Special Collections in the History of Medicine is the only collection in the state entirely devoted to providing resources on the history of medicine in New Jersey.

Printing is managed through the Papercut system.
