Celebrating Another Chance at Life “Re-Birthday Party” Will Highlight the Miracle of Liver Transplantation

WHAT:

American Liver Foundation, University Hospital, Rutgers New Jersey Medical School and NJ Sharing Network will host a “Re-Birthday Party” to celebrate those who are alive today because of a liver transplant. The event will include their personal testimonies about how someone else’s gift of life, through organ donation, saved their life. In addition to honoring transplant recipients, living donors, and donor families, this event will celebrate the 25th anniversary of New Jersey’s first liver transplant which was performed in 1989 at University Hospital in Newark.

WHY:

More than 120,000 people are on the national transplant waiting list. Each day, 18 people die waiting for a life-saving organ transplant, and nearly 5,000 are waiting in New Jersey alone. They are our family members, colleagues, neighbors, and friends. This event will celebrate those who received a transplant and share the latest news in liver transplantation.

Approximately 6,000 liver transplants are performed in the U.S. each year. The University Hospital Center for Liver Diseases is the only liver transplant center in northern New Jersey and has performed 1,321 liver transplants since being established in 1989.

Many patients, such as Elizabeth Roberts-Coral of Wayne, New Jersey, are a living testament of the University Hospital Center for Liver Diseases' life-saving work. A home health aide and native of Peru, Roberts-Coral is considered a miracle. She received a liver transplant in 2000 and another in 2013 due to several health complications following a trip abroad. At one point, she was only given a five percent chance of living. Roberts-Coral, however, is alive and thriving today.

Another transplant recipient, Joseph Rufalo of Kenilworth, New Jersey, received a liver transplant last October. A pianist who has performed with Bob Dylan and Muddy Waters, he will be sharing his musical gifts at the Re-birthday Party.
